If these dates do not work for you, please connect with me on scheduling an alternate time - <u>so important</u> I meet with <u>EVERY</u> 6<sup>th</sup> grade family!

We will board the bus at Roosevelt and head over to North to learn more about the transition, opportunities, and people who will be a part of your child's life over the next few years!
