Dear Parents,

Congratulations on making it through the first weeks of the 2016 school year. As we settle into our routine, I thought I would take a moment to outline the safety drills and procedures we have in place at Roosevelt.

Throughout the year, we are required to practice certain emergency drills, so students know how to respond in case of an actual emergency. Practice drills include: fire drills, evacuation drills, hall checks, flood drills, lockdowns and drop/cover/hold. For August and September, I put the drills on the Roosevelt website, so parents can talk to their child about these drills, if needed.

Overall, the drills take around five minutes; however, in the in the event of an actual evacuation, such as a gas leak, we will evacuate to Adams Elementary School. The staff at Adams know to prepare the cafeteria and nurse for our students and staff. There will be a nurse on duty and all medicine will be brought to Adams by office staff. An evacuation can be a little nerve-racking for kids, so we kindly ask that in such an event, all parents/guardians wait outside the front doors of Adams until we have students safe and comfortable. We will then wait to hear from District officials for next steps. We have a system in place for student check out, but it does require patience from everyone.

Also, some of you have inquired into the volume of our emergency bells. We have district officials coming out this Wednesday to test the volume. There is a certain code for these bells, but I am hoping we can turn these down a little. If you have any other questions about safety procedures, please feel free to email me.

Again, thank you for an amazing start to the school year.

I want to introduce myself and our new health tech to you. I am Claudia Terrell and I have been a school nurse for the last 26 years, and I have been at Roosevelt and Garfield for the last 18 years! My health tech is Mardi Coffelt and she also works at Garfield and Riverside. We are excited to be here at Roosevelt this year and look forward to taking care of your children. Roosevelt has health coverage on Monday all day, Tuesday mornings and all day Thursday. We are also available by phone or e-mail if we are at our other schools.

Not only do we provide first aid, medication administration, communicable disease control and immunization monitoring at school, we also provide health screenings for all KG, 2nd, and 5th grade students. We will screen vision, dental height, weight, and on 5th grade girls we will screen for scoliosis. We will let you know if we have any concerns with those results. If your child is not in one of those grades and you are concerned in one of those areas, we are glad to screen them also. Just call or e-mail us.

As the nurse, I also teach Health and Illness lessons to all classes as well as growth and development lessons to 5th and 6th graders.
